Town Manager/Island Operations Director Comments:

Island life has definitely slowed down, but it's great to see the number of people still here. Just a few notes this week.

Marina: This is the annual reminder that all boats have to be removed from the Marinas by Monday, October 14.

Paddock Circle: Remember that all trailers and other items stored in the Paddock Circle trailer parking area must be removed every year by Columbus Day (October 14th this year). As usual, any items left after that date will have to be treated as abandoned property.

New Ordinances: This is another reminder that changes to Beach Ordinance and several parts of the Land Use Ordinance including regulations for tree cutting, lot surveys, camping and signs were adopted at the Annual Meeting on August 31, and were effective immediately following the meeting. These were published in the meeting warrant, which was posted and distributed by town-wide email, and are available on the website in "Public Documents." Of particular note are the requirement that any cutting of trees, including lot clearing and selective cutting, requires a permit by the Code enforcement Officer (which is free of charge), and the rule that any work that changes the footprint of structures on a property (including buildings, decks, septic systems, driveways, parking areas, etc.) requires a boundary survey, unless the requirement is waived in writing by the code enforcement officer because it is obvious that the proposed work will not violate setback or other regulations.

Lot Numbers vs. Addresses: Lot numbers are very useful on Frye Island because they are a unique identifier for each property, independent of the road on which the property is located. However, as of last year, your **address**, for mailing, utilities, and all other purposes requiring a physical address, is your **e-911 number and street**. It's not a good idea to use your lot number with the road name for any purpose because it creates confusion, particularly in locations where lot numbers and street address numbers are similar. If you need to identify your property by lot number (which is very helpful sometimes), use "Lot xxxx" and do not include the road name. Otherwise use your street address. This could go a long way toward resolving some of the confusion that still exists.

Please enjoy what for many is the best time of year on Frye Island, as we start to move into Fall.

At the meeting last Saturday, rules for tree cutting and lot clearing were revised. The underlined statements are new and will be implemented immediately. There is no cost for a tree cutting permit.

4. Permissible Cutting and Clearing

- a. Any cutting of trees, including selective cutting and clear cutting for construction shall require a permit issued by the Code Enforcement Officer. Any areas to be clear cut shall be delineated on a site plan to be submitted with the permit application. Trees to be selectively cut shall each be identified by a ribbon for inspection and approval by the Code Enforcement Officer.
- b. No building permit may be issued without an approved tree cutting plan, including a site plan with any areas to be clear-cut clearly delineated, and the approximate location of trees to be selectively cut identified.

The requirements of § 101-III-15 N.3 shall apply to all lots in any Residential District in the Town, with the permissible clearing being calculated as though the entire lot were within the Shoreland Zone at distances greater than 100 feet, horizontal distance, from Sebago Lake.

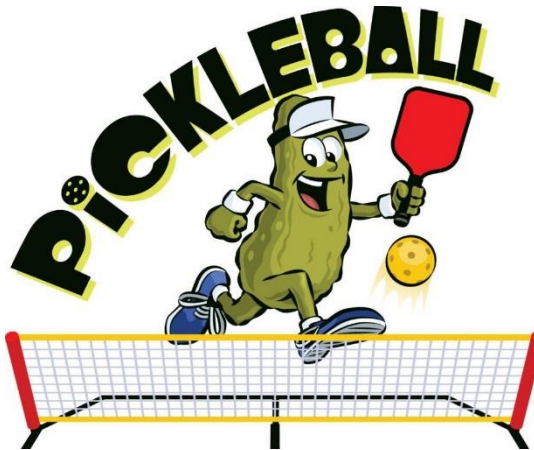
Volunteers Needed for Frye't Fest

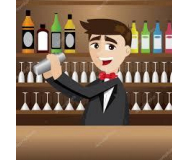
